In keeping with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Principles of Accreditation: Foundations for Quality Enhancement, St. Philip's College would like to notify you of a substantive change to be implemented fall 2022. The change relates to closing an off-campus instructional site.

In Spring 2022, Memorial Early College High School, located at 1419 N. Business IH 35 New Braunfels, TX 78130, entered into discussions to offer dual credit courses with Northeast Lakeview College. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) allows high schools to partner with the institution of their choice (Texas Education Code (TEC) §28.009). Therefore, St. Philip's will allow currently enrolled juniors and seniors to finish their program through the College. No new students will be admitted as of fall 2022. All incoming freshmen and currently enrolled sophomores may enroll with the new partner Northeast Lakeview College starting fall 2022.

The teach-out plan is attached.

Teach-out Plan

Memorial Early College High School – Associate of Arts

A teach-out plan is a written plan developed by an institution that provides for the equitable treatment of students if an institution, or an institutional location that provides fifty percent or more of at least one program, ceases to operate before all students have completed their program of study, and may include, if required by the institution's accrediting agency, a teach-out agreement between institutions. Parents/students were informed by the School when the switch to Northeast Lakeview College was finalized.

3. An explanation of how all affected students will be helped to complete their programs of study with minimal disruption.

The students can continue taking the dual credit courses offered at the other college.

4. An indication as to whether the teach-out plan will incur additional charges/expenses to the students and, if so, how the students will be notified.

No cost to Dual Credit students.

5. Copies of signed teach-out agreements with other institutions, if any.

There is not a signed teach-out agreement for the courses with Memorial Early College High School. Not applicable.

6. How faculty and staff will be redeployed or helped to find new employment.

All instructors were St. Philip's College adjunct instructors, they had the opportunity to apply as an adjunct with Northeast Lakeview College, if they so wished. The school staff at Memorial Early College High School are still employed at the school.

7. If closing an institution, arrangement for the storing of student records, disposition of final financial resources and other assets.

Not applicable. St. Philip's College and Memorial Early College High School are operational institutions, as of November 17, 2022.
