Palo Alto College celebrates cultures of south Texas during annual Heritage Month

Alamo Colleges District-Palo Alto College will celebrate its 2019 Heritage Month from Sept. 16 to Oct. 14 to honor the indigenous heritages of South Texas. The month will include a series of free events including panel discussions, author readings, artist visits, and more.

A kickoff celebration will take place Monday, Sept. 16, with special guests District 4 City Councilwoman Dr. Adriana Rocha Garcia and San Antonio Poet Laureate Dr. Octavio Quintanilla; a blessing featuring Grupo de Danza Azteca Xinachtli; live music from Bombasta; and free food.

All 2019 Heritage Month events at Palo Alto College are free and open to the public. The events are sponsored by several Palo Alto College programs including the Center for Mexican American Studies, Office of Student Life, and the Student Activities Fee. Featured events include:
