Palo Alto College celebrates the cultures of south Texas during Heritage Month 2017

Alamo Colleges District-Palo Alto College will celebrate Heritage Month from Sept. 18 to Oct. 12 to honor the indigenous heritages of South Texas, such as Native American, Mexican American, Hispanic, Latino/a, Mexican, Chicano/a, and Afro-Latin. The month will include a series of events including author readings, panel discussions, films, theater performances, exhibits, and more.

A kickoff celebration will take place Monday, Sept. 18, with a blessing featuring Grupo de Danza Azteca Xinachtli; special reading by Dr. Carmen Tafolla, former San Antonio Poet Laureate and Texas Poet Laureate; and musical performances from El Tallercito de Son SATX and Grupo Frackaso.

All 2017 Heritage Month events at Palo Alto College are free and open to the public. The events are sponsored by several Palo Alto College programs including the Center for Mexican American Studies, Office of Student Life, Working Writers Series Committee, Teatro Palo Alto, and the Ozuna Library. Featured events include:

- Oct. 4: Reading and Discussion of Blue Texas: The Making of a Multiracial Democratic Coalition in the Civil Rights Era by Max Krochmal
- Oct. 5: Poetry/Rap Slam hosted by National Slam Poets Amalia Ortiz and Anthony "The Poet" Flores
- Oct. 9: Indigenous Peoples Day/Día de la Raza Ceremony featuring the American Indians of Texas
- Oct. 12: Health and Wela-Ness: a panel discussion on the healing practices of our ancestors
