The change relates to Substantive Change Procedure One: The Review of Substantive Changes Requiring Notification and Approval Prior to Implementation.

Having gained approval from the Alamo Community College District Board of Trustees and the Alamo College Curriculum Council, St. Philip's College anticipates offering the new academic field of study effective fall 2016, pending Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board approval.

The mission of Mexican American Studies is to strengthen the next generation by building knowledge about local and global communities and by sharing that information across social, intellectual, and geographic boundaries. Mexican American Studies is an international, crossdisciplinary program of study intending to provide students an opportunity to understand and work with the experiences, values, cultural representations, and socio-economic issues of the Mexican American community.

The new program requirements are as follows:

## **Associate of Arts in Mexican American Studies** No significant number of new courses No significant number of new faculty members

No additional financial resources needed

No additional equipment or facilities needed

Previously approved, related programs include: History, Humanities, Liberal Arts, and Spanish

Because this field of study will lead to an Associate of Arts degree with only 18 hours having the possibility of being significantly different from current offerings, this coursework should not be considered a significant departure. Required courses are as follows:
