

Message from the Alamo Colleges District:

The Alamo Colleges District is committed to providing a supportive learning environment and to fostering, safe, healthy relationships among our students.

The <u>AlamoCARES</u> website provides information on student rights, responsibilities, and on/off campus resources. A <u>Resource Guide for Students</u> explains policies, procedures and support services.

Sexual Assault Prevention for Community Colleges is an online survey and course addressing critical life skills. All entering freshmen, former and transfer students are required to complete Part 1 of SAPCC, by November 1st.

Students in Alamo Colleges District high schools programs are <u>not</u> included in this requirement.

Over half a million college students across the country will join you in completing such educational programs designed to keep you and our colleges safe.

It is our sincere desire that AlamoCARES, SAPCC and other prevention activities regarding dating and domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking will empower you to make well-informed decisions about issues that affect your college. years and beyond.

SAPCC Instructions:

- 1. Always sign in through ACES at https://alamoaces.alamo.edu.
- Look for the AlamoCARES box on the Student tab and read the important message before accessing the course. Note: an alternative training is available; see your Vice President for Student Success for assistance.
- Click on the link provided, and complete the confidential pre-survey at the start of the course. The Alamo Colleges District does not receive a copy of your responses.
- 4. The quiz at the end of the course is required to document your completion, but the <u>score</u> is not recorded and will not impact you in any way. <u>Completion</u> is documented on your student record.
- 5. Students completing *SAPCC* after November 1 will be cleared to register within 24 hours.

Part 1 of Sexual Assault Prevention for Community Colleges must be completed by November 1st or a registration hold will be placed on your record
