Palo Alto College celebrates cultures of south Texas during Latinx Heritage Month

Alamo Colleges District-Palo Alto College will celebrate its 2021 Latinx Heritage Month from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15 to honor the indigenous heritages of South Texas. The month will include a series of free virtual events, including panel discussions, author readings, artist visits, and more.

A kickoff celebration will take place Wednesday, Sept. 15, with keynote speaker Cherríe Moraga, an internationally recognized poet, essayist, and playwright. She has penned several collections, including A Xicana Codex of Changing Consciousness, Loving in The War Years, and Waiting in the Wings: Portrait of a Queer Motherhood.

Lalo Alcaráz, an award-winning visual/media artist and television/film writer, will host a second keynote address on Tuesday, Sept. 21. Alcaráz served as a Cultural Consultant on the Oscar-winning Day of the Dead-themed animated global hit Pixar movie Coco. He has a forthcoming graphic history novel, UNIDOS, about the historic civil rights group UnidosUS, formerly National Council of La Raza.

All of Palo Alto College's 2021 Latinx Heritage Month virtual events are free and open to the public. The events are sponsored by several Palo Alto College programs, including the Center for Mexican American Studies, Office of Student Life, Working Writers Series, PAC STEM Center, and the Student Activities Fee.
