




### Course Completion Rates


### **Productive Grade Rates**






#### Fall-to-Fall FTIC Persistence Rates






### FT FTIC Comparative Persistence Rates





















### Four-Year FT FTIC Graduation Rates






Degrees and Certificates Awarded (Targets and Actuals)





# 6-Year FTIC Transfer Rates (Based on NSC Data)








