## SPC Graduates, Transfer Institutions, and Majors 2017-2021

Figure 65-1 (right) displays the counts of SPC graduates and those graduates who “transferred” the subsequent fall. For the purpose of this data, a student who enrolls at an institution of higher education the fall following their graduation year is considered to have transferred. As depicted in the figure, 2021 saw the highest number of transfer enrollment, while 2017 had the lowest transfer count. On average, 31% of SPC graduates continue their education beyond graduation.

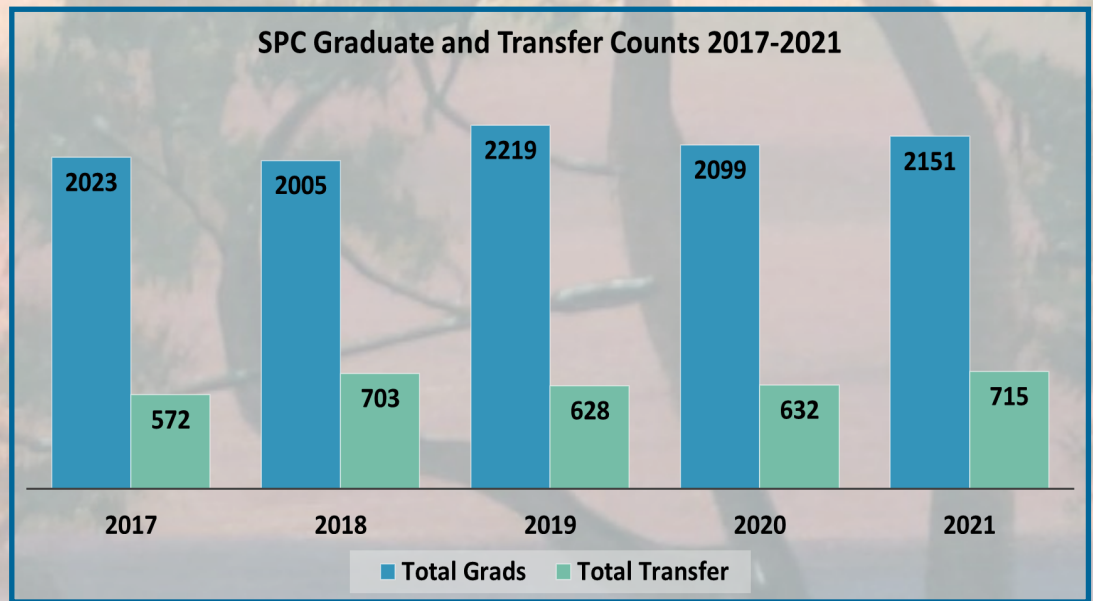



Figure 65-1 SPC graduates and transfer counts by academic year

Figure 65-2 (left) features the percentage of total SPC graduates who enrolled in higher education the subsequent fall. For example, in this calculation, a student who graduated in academic year 2017 AND enrolled in fall 2017 at the same or another institution is considered in the transfer percentage. It is important to note that this data does not demonstrate the transfer rate, which examines specific student cohorts based on initial enrollment term. As shown, the percentage of “transfer” students consistently lands in the 28-36% range with the 5-year low occurring in fall 2017 and 2019 (28.3%) and the high in fall 2018 (35.1%).

Figure 65-3 (above) details the top transfer institutions for SPC graduates. Because SPC was the number 1 transfer destination each year 2017-2021, the top 6 transfer institutions are included. Year indicates the academic year in which the student graduated from SPC and the calendar year in which the subsequent fall enrollment occurred. Enrollment trends show Texas A&M University-San Antonio (TAMUSA), University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA), Texas State University-San Marcos, and University of the Incarnate Word (UIW) are the top 4 universities for transfer. Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi (TAMU-CC) made its first appearance on the list in 2021. Only two other institutions made the list, San Antonio College (in 2017 and 2018) and Texas Lutheran University (in 2019 and 2020, also in the Grand Total, which contains overall enrollment totals).

Three majors appear in the top 5 every year surveyed in Figure 65-4 (below): Biology/Biological Sciences, General, Multi-/Interdisciplinary Studies, Other, and Business Administration and Management, Other, while Registered Nursing/Registered Nurse is seen in 4 of the 5 featured years, and Psychology, General has emerged as a top major for the last two years.
