June 8: "The most important words that have helped me in life, when things have gone right or when things have gone wrong, are 'accept responsibility." Billie Jean King

1943: born in Long Beach, California to Betty (née Jerman), a housewife who excelled in swimming; and Bill Moffitt, a firefighter who excelled in baseball, basketball, and track; her younger brother <u>Randy Moffitt</u> pitches in the Major Leagues for twelve years.

1954: parents urge her to change from softball to the more "lady-like" sport of tennis; suggest she take small, odd jobs to earn the \$8 to buy her first tennis racket; learns to play at the free Long Beach public courts, with free public lessons from tennis professional <u>Clyde Walker</u>.

1972: joint winner, with John Wooden, of the Sports Illustrated Sportsman of the Year

1973 "<u>Battle of the Sexes</u>:" defeats (6-4, 6-3, 6-3) 55-year-old <u>Bobby Riggs</u>, #1 male player: 1946, 47, 48 who, four months earlier, had defeated (6-2, 6-1) <u>Margaret Court</u>, seven-time #1 female player: 1962, 63, 64 (co-), 65, 69, 70, 73 in straight sets. Overall, King later retires as a six-time #1 female player: 1966 (co-), 67, 68, 71 (co-), 72, 74 (co-). 1973: founds the Women's Tennis Association

1974: founds the Women's Sports Foundation

1975: honored as one of the *Time* Persons of the Year

1987: inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame

1990: inducted National Women's Hall of Fame

**2006**: the <u>USTA National Tennis Center</u> in New York City is renamed the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center. 2009: receives the <u>Presidential Medal of Freedom</u>

2018: receives BBC Sports Personality of the Year Lifetime Achievement Award.

King wins 39 <u>Grand Slam</u> titles: 12 in singles, 16 in women's doubles, 11 in mixed doubles; wins the 1972 inaugural <u>WTA Tour Championships</u> singles title; in team competitions, wins international <u>Federation Cup</u> seven times and the <u>Wightman Cup</u> (U.S. versus Great Britain) nine times; captain of the U.S. Federation Cup team for three years.
