Student Success across Award Types & First Generation

Figure 66-1 (top right) features SPC award counts by award type for academic years 2019, 2020, and 2021. As shown, more Level I Certificates (Cert1) were earned per year than any other award type, but the total declined between 2020 and 2021. Conversely, all other award types increased from 2020 to 2021, while the associate of science (AS) and associate of arts in teaching (AAT) degrees awarded rose across all three academic years.

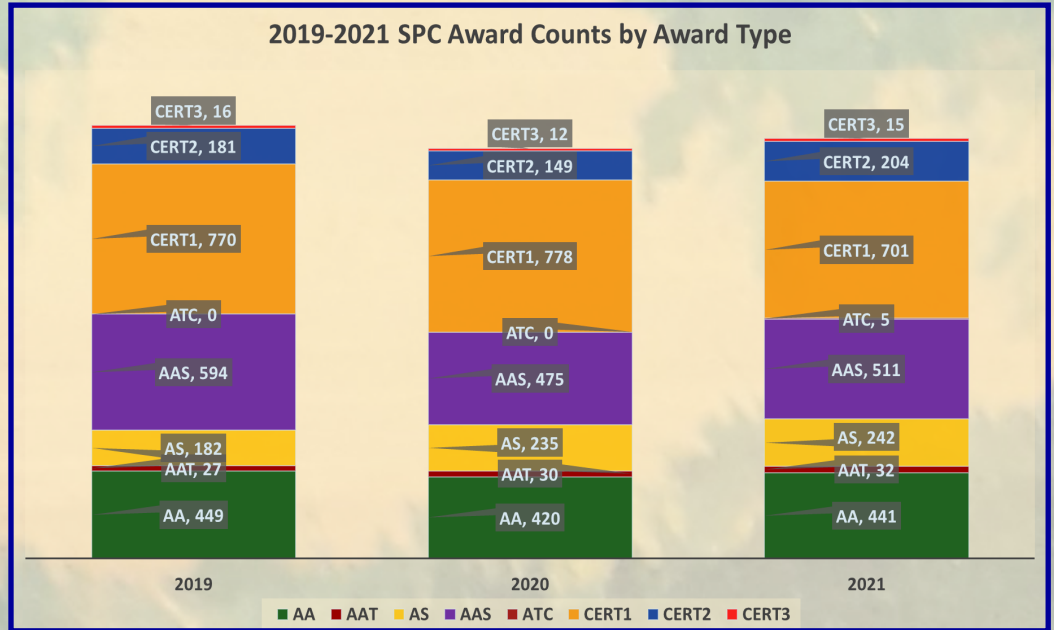


Figure 66-1 SPC awards by award type 2019-2021

Figure 66-2 (bottom right) displays award counts based on first generation status, which is estimated from optional student responses regarding parental educational attainment. First generation students are estimated to account for greater than 30% of all annual awards: 36.3% in 2019, 35.5% in 2020, and 31.5% in 2021.

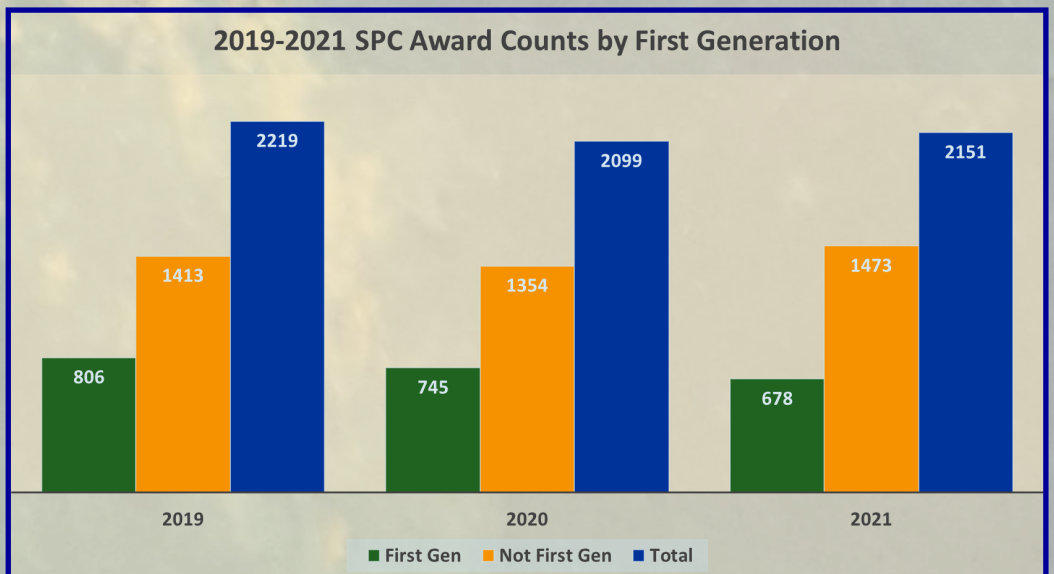


Figure 66-2 SPC awards by first generation 2019-2021

2019-2021 Awards by Student Demographics

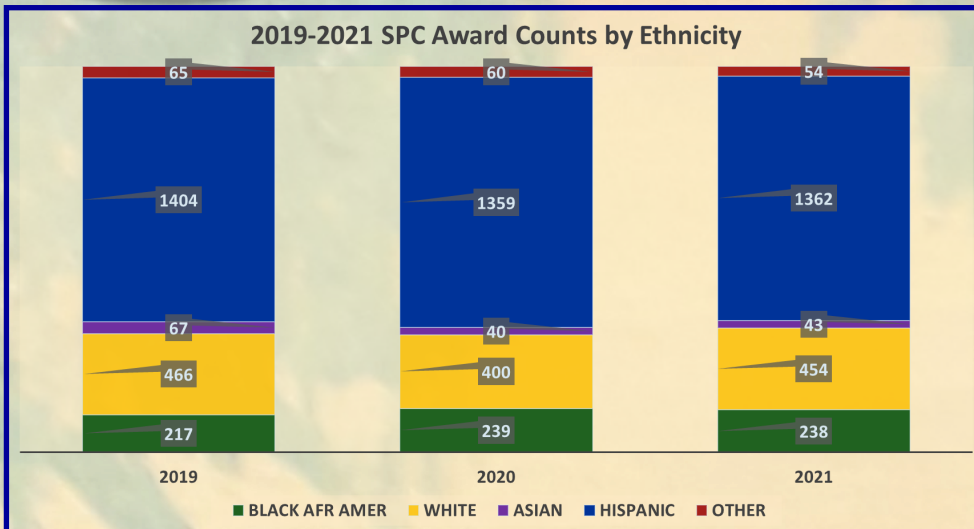


Figure 66-3 (left) shows award distribution by ethnicity, with Hispanic students receiving the majority of awards (>60%) in all featured academic years.

Figure 66-4 (below) provides award counts by gender. Per CBM009, this data is limited to female and male, with males receiving more awards in each of the past three academic years (AY), although this gap decreased to 21 awards in AY 2021.

As displayed in Figure 66-5 (below), students aged 18-21 consistently comprise the largest number of awards by age group despite a modest decline from 2020 to 2021 (-40), which followed a sizeable increase of 112 from 2019 to 2020. While the greatest decline in awards occurred among 25-30 from 2019 to 2020 (-121), this group accounted for the second largest number of awards in 2019 and 2021. Groups between 31 and 50 achieved 3-year highs in 2021 with 214 awards for ages 31-35 and 311 awards among the 36-50 age group.

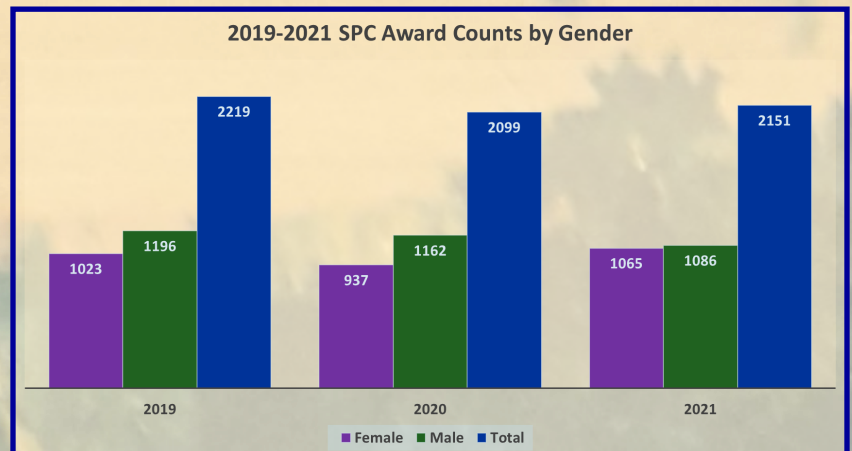


Figure 66-4 SPC awards by gender* 2019-2021

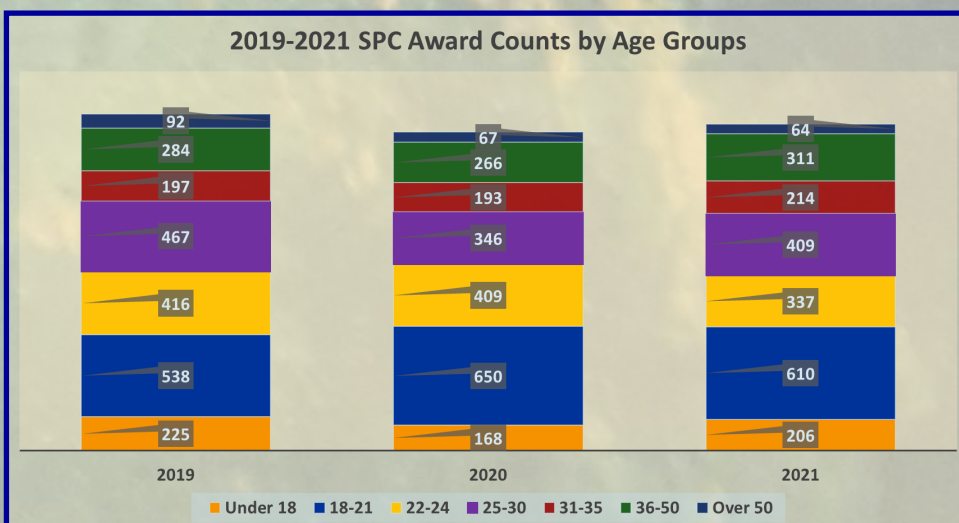


Figure 66-5 SPC awards by age group 2019-2021
