

Cybersecurity Program Earns Prestigious NSA Designation

St. Philip's College received the National Centers of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense Program of Study Validation by the National Security Agency (NSA). This recognition extends to the Information Technology Cybersecurity Specialist program through the 2026 academic year. St. Philip's joins other nationally validated programs to produce high-quality cybersecurity professionals to safeguard the U.S. national infrastructure.

The Associate of Applied Science Degree in Information Technology Cybersecurity Specialist prepares students to design, implement and secure computer networks. Students with this degree will be able to install security software, monitor networks for security breaches, respond to cyber-attacks, and gather data and evidence to be used in prosecuting cybercrime. The program is a total of 60 credit hours and is offered both in-person and online.

Students graduating from the program can receive a certificate to show that they have completed the requirements of a Centers of Academic Excellence Program of Study. Though graduates will be entering high-demand fields, the credential will further enhance their professional prospects.

In addition, cyber students have the experience of being prepared through a National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense (CAE-CD), a program jointly sponsored by the National Security Agency and Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

Since then, the Department of Business Information Solutions has grown to offer five unique cybersecurity degree and certificate options -- one of which holds the National Centers of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense Program of Study Validation by the National Security Agency (NSA). The College is also designated as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense (CAE-CD), a prestigious program jointly sponsored by the NSA and Department of Homeland Security.

CAE-CD is one of the most difficult designations to receive, as the College is assessed on its research, program offerings, multidisciplinary approach, performance in cyber competitions, and many other factors.

These milestones recognize our cybersecurity programs for being among the best in the country and acknowledge the innovative learning environment offered to our students. Cybersecurity graduates are equipped with the skills and experience to enter a workforce that safeguards and promotes national security.

As programs continue to grow, our duty to provide spaces where students can thrive academically remains a priority. Later this year, we will open the new Saint Artemisia Bowden Building that will accommodate various programs including cybersecurity.

The building will feature a cuttingedge cyber range used to work on various tools, techniques, and systems in a secure network to simulate real-world challenges such as cyber-attacks and data breaches. With this supercomputing power, SPC will continue to produce high-quality cybersecurity professionals to safeguard the U.S. national infrastructure and meet the growing demand for cybersecurity experts.

indicating that the College is helping reduce threats to our national infrastructure by promoting higher education and research in cyber defense as well as providing the nation with a pipeline of qualified cybersecurity professionals.

Students have access to collaboration with industry partners and internship opportunities available only to students from CAE-CD institutions. St. Philip's College offers internships with local industry leaders such as Cisco, USAA, and IBM. SPC information technology programs have a job placement rate of 87 percent with many students continuing their education at a university level. CAE-CD redesignation extends through the academic year 2027.

SPC Earns 'Grow with Google' Grant for Career Readiness

St. Philip's College announced participation in the Grow with Google HSI Career Readiness Program. The initiative will help Latino students at over 20 Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs) prepare for the workforce through digital skills training and career workshops. Through a \$2 million investment in the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU), the program will train 200,000 Latino students by 2025. Northeast Lakeview College, Palo Alto College, and San Antonio College are also partners.

Latino workers face systemic barriers to economic opportunity, including a lack of access to digital skills training. Over 80% of U.S. jobs require digital skills, but 55% of Latinos have little to no digital skills training. Latinos are also overrepresented in jobs that are at the highest risk of elimination due to automation, furthering the need to upskill for an increasingly digital economy.

In partnership with HACU, the Grow with Google HSI Career Readiness Program will provide St. Philip's College with funding and a semester-long, in-person, and online digital skills program. The initiative will combine career workshops, career counseling, and programming on design thinking, project management, and professional brand building.

"The Grow with Google Grant increases learning opportunities for St. Philip's College students. The grant provides students with tools to build interpersonal skills that are vital to success in the workplace, including



critical thinking, intercultural fluency, professional speaking, writing, and leadership," said St. Philip's College President Dr. Adena Williams Loston. "Access to this additional resource helps our graduates transition from the classroom into high-wage, highly skilled positions in support of our region's economic growth."

SPC Awarded Grant to Boost Community College Adult Enrollment





St. Philip's College was recently awarded a \$75,000 grant from Lumina Foundation to further efforts to increase adult student enrollment. SPC is one of only 20 community colleges in the nation to receive funding.

The Prioritizing Adult Community College Enrollment initiative identifies and supports promising strategies for increasing adult participation particularly among Black, Hispanic and Latino, and Native American studentsin quality credit-bearing and non-credit programs.

A partnership effort of Achieving the Dream, Ideas 42, rpkGroup, Equal Measure, and Rockefeller Philanthropy Advisors will support grant recipients. The group includes five rural, six suburban, and nine urban colleges. Among these are eight Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs), one historically Black college, one Asian American and Native American-Pacific IslanderServing Institution (AANAPISI), and one institution designed solely to serve incarcerated students.

Palo Alto College, San Antonio College, Northeast Lakeview College, and Northwest Vista College are also recipients of the grant. All colleges will receive a flexible grant of up to \$75,000, along with technical assistance in behavioral design and planning for sustainable enrollment efforts.

SPC Grad Named Executive Chef of Award-Winning Eatery

Carpenter is a graduate of the St. Philip's College Culinary Arts program. After earning his degree, he began cooking as a professional, working his way up the ranks in the kitchens of top San Antonio restaurants including Beat Street Bistro and Nao Gastro Bar. Carpenter earned his first job as Head Chef at the age of 24 in 2011, and in 2015, Carpenter joined The Culinary Institute of America as Chef. Before joining Signature, Carpenter was a Chef at Botika located in the Pearl Brewery.

Like Carpenter, many students enroll in the Culinary Arts program at St. Philip's College as aspiring hospitality industry professionals. The program, which is recognized as exemplary by both the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the American Culinary Federation, allows graduates to attain Certified Culinarian status from the American Culinary Federation.

Graduates are prepared for rigorous career demands that support hospitality industries vital to the San Antonio and South Texas economies. The industry is currently the city's second-largest and has an estimated \$15.2 billion impact on the city's economy.


FALL 2021 GRADUATION
