Deadlines and Important ACCD Trustee Candidate Information Uniform General Election on Saturday, May 4, 2024

Remember:

- A campaign treasurer must be appointed **BEFORE** an Application for a Place on the Ballot is filed.
- A campaign treasurer must be appointed by filing the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer form prescribed by the Texas Ethics Commission (Form CTA).
- > Filing of an Appointment of Campaign Treasurer triggers duty to file campaign finance reports.
- Four initial campaign finance reports are required to be filed.
- > Candidates and officeholders are responsible for knowing all finance report filing deadlines.
- ➤ All election-related forms must be filed with the ACCD Secretary of the Board of Trustees.

Eligibility Requirements for ACCD Trustee Position

Per Texas Election Code §141.001, to be eligible to be a candidate for, or elected or appointed to, a public elective office in Texas, a person must:

- (1) be a United States citizen;
- (2) be 18 years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled at the election or on the date of appointment, as applicable;
- (3) have not been determined by a final judgment of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be:

- (A) totally mentally incapacitated; or (B) partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote;
- (4) have not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities;
- (5) have resided continuously in the state for 12 months and in the territory from which the office is elected for six months immediately preceding the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot;*
- (6) on the date described by Subdivision (5), be registered to vote in the territory from which the office is elected; and
- (7) satisfy any other eligibility requirements prescribed by law for the office.**
- * Per Texas Election Code § 141.001(a-1): For purposes of satisfying the continuous residency requirement of Subsection (a)(5), a person who claims an intent to return to a residence after a temporary absence may establish that intent only if the person:
 - (1) has made a reasonable and substantive attempt to effectuate that intent; and
 - (2) has a legal right and the practical ability to return to the residence.
- **Other Eligibility Requirement of Tex. Elec. Code § 141.001 (a)(7). Per Texas Education Code §130.0822, a candidate for trustee must be a resident of the trustee single-member district the candidate seeks to represent at the time of application for a place on the ballot.
