### SPC Allied Health Programs Accredited and Certified

St. Philip's College (SPC) was recently notified of the following accreditation in allied health education programs: Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program earned initial accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) in both Abdominal –Extended and Obstetrics and Gynecology concentrations; Invasive Cardiovascular Technology Program earned continuing accreditation by CAAHEP, the Early Childhood and Family Studies Program earned continuing accreditation by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) and the Nurse Aide for Health Care Program earned recertification as a Nurse Aide Training Program by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission.
