Through the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), (student aid and institutional funds) and American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds (student aid), St. Philip's College was awarded \$6.4 million to assist students either with direct aid or aid for tuition balances.
