SPC Enhances Health Sciences Sim Center with Equipment Purchase

St. Philip's College (SPC) acquired SimMan3G PLUS for high fidelity nursing and health sciences simulation experiences. Features include simulated breathing with chest rise/fall, life-like skin, pupillary responses, realistic vital signs via palpation/auscultation, and the ability to utilize real diagnostic tools for blood pressure/ECG/pulse oximetry. Simulation equipment prepares students for real-life patient scenarios in a safe learning environment. SimMan3G PLUS is African American. The manufacturer, Laerdal Medical made this intentional decision to address health disparities as noticed during COVID-19 and to prepare healthcare providers to meet the needs of diverse patients. SimMan3G PLUS became available to students on Feb. 14, 2022.
