



REAL ESTATE PROGRAM

Are you interested in pursuing a challenging and rewarding career in real estate? Start your training to become a Real Estate Sales Agent! A sales agent is a person who is licensed by the Texas Real Estate Commission (TREC) to act as an agent on behalf of a real estate broker and their clients. This program provides the 180 classroom hours of qualifying education required before you can apply to become a Sales Agent with TREC. Upon successful completion of the program, you will file an application with TREC*, submit your course completion documents, get your fingerprints taken and pass your background check. A license will not issue if the background check has not been passed. Call 210-486-4421 for information on upcoming classes.

*Notice: A criminal history may make you ineligible for the license you seek. You may request a criminal history evaluation prior to enrolling in courses or applying for a real estate, inspector or appraiser license. Please refer to the criminal history eligibility guidelines set out in Texas Occupations Code §53.025 and TREC Rule 541.1. Potential applicants for a license may request a criminal history evaluation by submitting a completed Moral Character Determination Form to TREC prior to applying for a license.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

The Basic Peace Officer Program is approved by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) and consists of 688 classroom hours divided into four separate phases. Qualifications: You must have either a High School Diploma or GED or have served two years active military duty. ATTENDANCE

In general, our courses require 80% attendance in order for participants to receive a Certificate of Completion from Alamo Colleges District. In some instances courses have attendance requirements beyond this percentage. Refunds are determined on the date the course registration is cancelled. Any registration cancelled prior to the first day of class will receive a full refund. Cancellation after the first day of class does not qualify for any refund. Registration can be cancelled online via your ACES account. Refunds require up to 30 days to process. All tuition refunds for classes that are cancelled for low enrollment will be processed at 100%. Classes must be dropped prior to first class meeting for refund. For other drops, a full refund will be

returned if a written or faxed request is received from the student prior to the first day of class.


