With completion rates of 93% or better for 3 of the last 4 fall semesters, SPC students consistently demonstrate higher completion than that shown at other ACD institutions. As displayed in *Figure 9-1* (below), despite a slight decline from fall 2015 to fall 2016, SPC completion remained >1% higher than the second highest rate (92.41% at NVC) for the second consecutive year.

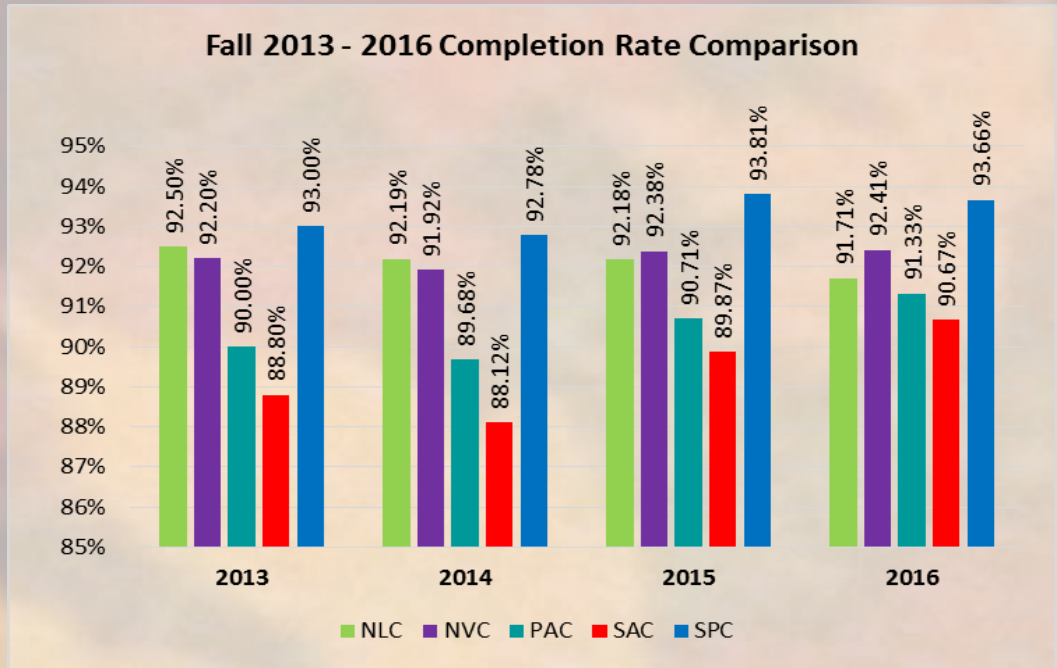


Figure 11-1 SPC Course Completion Rate Compared to Alamo Colleges District institutions

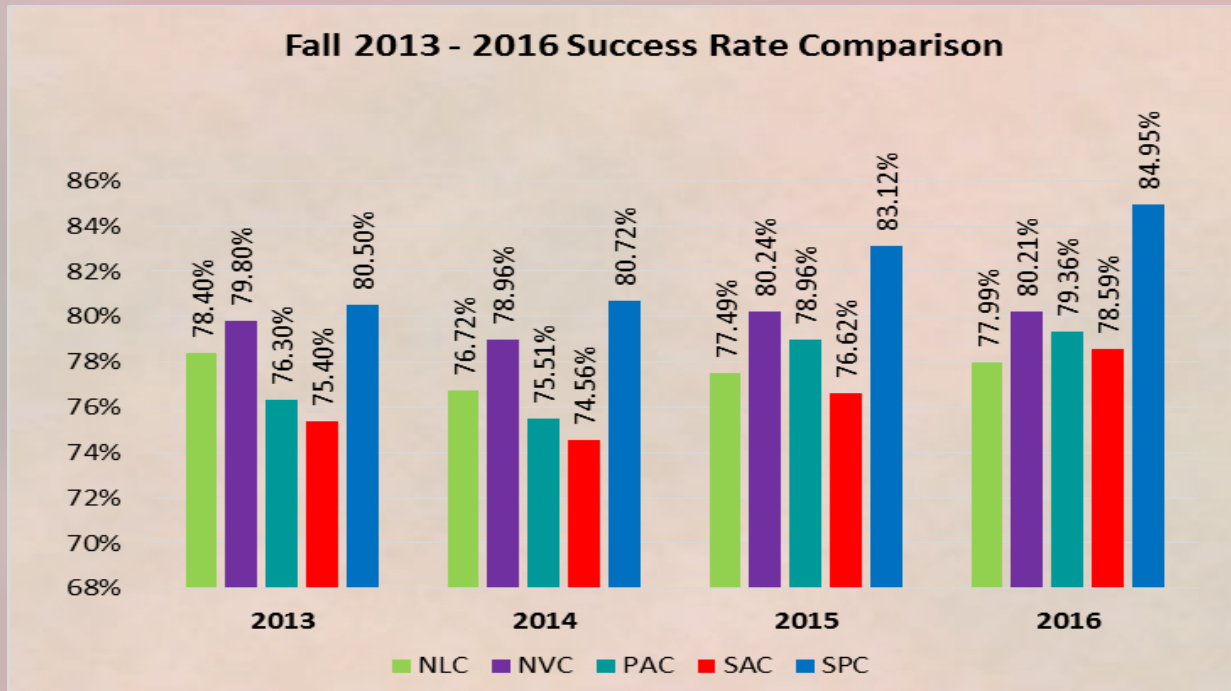


Figure 11-2 St. Philip’s College Success Rate compared to Alamo Colleges District institutions

As seen in *Figure 9-2* (above), not only have SPC students maintained the highest success rate in ACD from fall 2013 to fall 2016, but the success rate has risen annually from 80.50% in 2013 to 84.95% in 2016, with the largest increase occurring from 2014 (80.72%) to 2015 (83.12%). Despite some improvement from 2014 to 2016, NLC, PAC, and SAC remain below 80%, while NVC experienced a slight decrease between 2015 and 2016 to hover near 80%, giving SPC a success rate 4.74% higher than ACD second highest.
