






Fail Headcount Enroliment (Owner)










Fall 2019 Headcount by Institute









CCSSE: Percentage of Students Rating their Entire Educational Experience as "Good or Excellent"



Fall-to-Fall FTIC Persistence Rates













FT FTIC Comparative Persistence Rates




3-Year FTIC Graduation Rates














Degrees and Certificates Awarded 🔶




Degrees & Certificates Awarded by Ethnicity












Fall FT 2016 FTIC 3-Year Tracking











Math/Math CoReq Comparison












Student Loan 3-Year Default Rates
